PROPOSITIONS AND MOTIONS:

(Possible Consideration of Senate Amendments)

HB 2244 B-Eng GGCP 06/13/11 Holvey/Whisnant

Amends definition of “public record” in ORS 192.005 to include information that meets the following criteria: prepared, owned, used or retained by a state agency or political subdivision; relates to an activity, transaction or function of a state agency or political subdivision; and is necessary to satisfy the fiscal, legal, administrative or historical policies, requirements or needs of the state agency or political subdivision. Clarifies that “public record” does not include records of the Judicial Department, its officers or subdivisions, or spoken communication that is not recorded. **Requires state agencies to have a written policy that sets forth the agency’s use, retention and ownership of public records and to submit the written policy to the State Archivist for approval before the policy takes effect. Allows each agency to come up with their own policies.** Requires state agencies to maintain a public record without regard to the technology or medium used to create or communicate the record. Exempts from disclosure records of domestic violence service or resource center that concern individuals affected by domestic or sexual violence who visit center for referrals, resource information or related services, or individuals’ family members. Declares emergency, effective on passage Senate amendments replace the A-engrossed measure. (Senate vote: 27-0)

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Note:

Allows each state agency to have its own public records policy.

HB 3465 B-Eng AGNR CONCUR 06/22/11 Clem

Makes legislative findings related to working and cattle ranches. Subject to approval of master plan by Grant County, allows for development of guest ranch on property containing approximately 5,000 acres in common ownership located in township 17 south, range 31 east and township 17 south, range 32 east, Grant County. The development area may contain up to 575 units of overnight accommodations including lodging units, cabins, townhomes and fractional ownership. Requires deeds for overnight accommodations that are not lodging units, time shares or fractional ownerships to include deed restrictions that limit use of accommodations to use as overnight accommodations. Authorizes guest

ranch to include: restaurants, meeting facilities and commercial uses; developed recreational facilities including tennis courts, spa equestrian facilities, swimming pool and bicycle path. May not include sites for new residential dwellings unless otherwise permitted under existing law or developed for the use of employees of guest ranch. Specifies content of master plan and conditions for approval by Grant County. Declares emergency, effective on passage. Senate amendments replace original measure. (Senate vote: Ayes, 25; Nays, 2 – Dingfelder, George)

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Note:

This bill allows for development of one piece of property for one developer. Would it not be nice if **every land owner** could develop their property equally, having equal access and opportunity to develop their property as they see fit? Not just those who can get a special bill passed just for them

HB 5030 A-Eng WM dpa PE 06/10/11 Kotek

Budget: Department of Human Services (Committee vote: Ayes, 13 – Beyer, Cowan, Freeman, Garrard, Komp, Kotek, McLane, Nathanson, G. Smith, Thatcher, Whisnant, Buckley, Richardson; Nays, 1 – Nolan)

HB 3066 B-Eng WM dpa PE 06/21/11 Nathanson

Requires the Department of Justice to establish a restitution collection pilot program and to make grants sufficient to enable district attorney's offices to hire and employ one restitution clerk who would investigate evidence of the damages suffered by crime victims and the ability to pay of defendants.

Directs the Department of Justice to employ collection agents. Appropriates money from the Criminal Injuries Compensation Account. Sunsets January 2, 2014. Declares emergency, effective on passage. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 10 – Beyer, Cowan, Freeman, Garrard, Komp, Kotek, Nathanson, G. Smith, Buckley, Richardson; Nays, 4 – McLane, Nolan, Thatcher, Whisnant)

HB 3525 A-Eng WM dpa PE 06/21/11 Richardson

Creates the Courthouse Capitol Improvement Trust Fund and deposits in that fund moneys received from punitive damage awards. Directs that moneys in this trust be used for courthouse capital improvements. **Directs that 10% of punitive damage awards go to the trust fund.** (Committee Vote: Ayes, 11 – Beyer, Cowan, Freeman, Garrard, Komp, Kotek, Nathanson, G. Smith, Whisnant, Buckley, Richardson; Nays, 2 – McLane, Nolan)

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Note:

SENATE BILLS:

SB 829 A-Eng RULES dp 06/15/11 Holvey

Increases maximum annual production to 150,000 gallons for winery to be established as outright permitted use on exclusive farm use (EFU) land when grapes produced on at least 40 contiguous acres. Requires winery to provide on-site parking. Requires setback of at least 100 feet for winery and all public gathering places. Adds authorization for winery to be established as outright permitted use on EFU lands, or any area zoned for agricultural use on a parcel of land at least 80 contiguous acres if at least 50 acres of parcel have vineyards planted at least five years before winery is qualified to operate; owner owns at least 80 additional acres in Oregon of contiguous planted vineyards; and winery has produced at least 150,000 gallons of wine in at least three of last five years before qualifying. Authorizes winery established under Act to sell wines produced by the winery; items directly related to sale and promotion of wine produced by the winery; and services related to sale and promotion of wine including catered dinners, weddings, charitable or political events and other private events. Authorizes winery established under Act to operate full service restaurant. Authorizes local government to approve sale or delivery of other items or services. Prohibits person from having substantial ownership interest in more than one winery operating a full service restaurant. Requires local government to adopt findings on standards to limit conflicts with accepted farming or forest practices on adjacent lands, limited to establishment of setback of at least 100 foot from all property lines for winery and all public gathering places and

provisions for direct road access, internal circulation and parking. Requires winery to provide on-site parking. Declares emergency, effective upon passage. (Committee Vote: 7 - 0 - 1)

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Note:

We need to get the government out of so much land use regulation and allow the private sector to create jobs and industry for the state of Oregon.

SB 5529 A-Eng WM dp 06/16/11 Freeman

SB 5530 WM dp 06/16/11 Kotek

Ratifies fee changes adopted administratively by the Oregon Health Authority and approved by the Department of Administrative Services during the 2009-11 interim. Fees were established or adjusted for the Emergency Medical Services program, the Medical Marijuana program, the Lead Based Paint program, the Radiation Protection program, and the Drinking Water program. The fee changes are expected to generate a total of \$506,097 in new revenue during the 2011-13 biennium. (Committee Vote: Ayes, 11 – Beyer, Cowan, Freeman, Komp, Kotek, McLane, Nathanson, G. Smith, Whisnant, Buckley, Richardson; Nays, 2 – Garrard, Thatcher)

SENATE BILLS:

SB 442 A-Eng WM dp 06/21/11 Cameron

Requires the Department of Transportation to establish a wine country license plate program upon receipt of an amount sufficient from private entities to cover the cost of creating the plate. Sets fees for wine country plate. Requires Department to collect fee for wine country plate upon renewal of registration in addition to at the time the plates are originally issued. Requires Department, after

deducting its administrative cost of the program, to deposit proceeds from the sale of the wine country plate program into an account designated by Oregon Tourism Commission. Requires the Commission, after deducting its cost of production of the plates including the administrative cost related to marketing the plate, to distribute the funds received through the program. Requires one-half of the funds to be distributed as matching grants to tourism promotion agencies to promote wine and culinary tourism. Requires grants to show a one-to-one match from sources other than the Oregon Business Development Department or Commission programs. Requires one-half of the funds to be distributed to tourism promotion agencies in amounts proportional to the amount of acreage in each region used for wine and grape production.
