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**SB 993** Excludes woody biomass combusted as fuel from definition of "solid waste. Excludes wood residue combusted as fuel from definitions that apply to solid waste regulation.

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Note:

**BACKGROUND:** Oregon law establishes a hierarchy for the management of solid waste. The first objective is to prevent the generation of the waste. If that is not possible, reuse is the next best option, followed by recycling, composting, and energy recovery. Safe disposal is the last option, if none of the others is feasible. The Department of Environmental Quality does not currently regulate biomass fuels as solid waste.

Senate Bill 993 specifically excludes woody biomass that is combusted as fuel by a facility that has obtained an air quality permit from the definition of solid waste.

It appears that the state is giving an exemption to woody biomass ash as far as regulation is concerned. There may be other costs associated with disposal but this appears to be a good bill. It also encourages woody biomass to be used as a fuel and that however is a losing proposition as far as economics is concerned. Biomass cannot be economically feasible as a product by itself. Biomass can only be feasible economically if it is coupled with a managed forest and sound timber harvest practices. In other words, we need to harvest timber, and have biomass as a secondary product,, and have biomass as a secondary product, to make biomass an economical product.

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**HR 5** Establishes limitations and deadlines for legislative measures for 2012 regular session of House of Representatives of Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly.

From Bill: HOUSE RESOLUTION

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon:

(1) This resolution constitutes a rule of proceeding of the House of Representatives of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly.

(2) The House of Representatives shall adhere to the following limitations for the 2012 regular session:

(a) Each Representative may request the Office of the Legislative Counsel to prepare, and may submit for introduction, no more than two drafts of measures.

(b) Each committee of the House of Representatives may request

the Office of the Legislative Counsel to prepare, and may submit for introduction, no more than five drafts of measures.

(c) The Joint Committee on Ways and Means may request the Office of the Legislative Counsel to prepare, and may submit for introduction, no more than 10 drafts of measures to be introduced in the House of Representatives.

(d) The Governor may request the Office of the Legislative Counsel to prepare, and may submit for introduction, no more than five drafts of measures on behalf of the Executive Branch to be introduced in the House of Representatives.

(e) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court may request the Office of the Legislative Counsel to prepare, and may submit for introduction, no more than five drafts of measures on behalf of the Judicial Branch to be introduced in the House of Representatives.

(3) All requests to prepare drafts of measures must be accompanied by a brief summary of the problem sought to be addressed, the proposed solution to the problem and any other relevant information about the proposed measure.

(4) The House of Representatives shall adhere to the following schedule and deadlines for the 2012 regular session of the Seventy-sixth Legislative Assembly:

(a) Members, committees, the Governor and the Chief Justice shall submit requests for drafts of measures to the Office of the Legislative Counsel on or before December 5, 2011.

(b) The Office of the Legislative Counsel shall deliver drafts of measures to requesters on or before January 9, 2012.

(c) Requesters shall submit drafts of measures for introduction to the House Desk no later than January 23, 2012.

(5) Notwithstanding Rules 2.05 and 2.10 of the Rules of the House of Representatives, on or before December 1, 2011, the Co-Speakers of the House of Representatives may jointly:

(a) Increase the maximum number of measures that Representatives may request and submit for introduction for the 2012 regular session. The increase may be made by providing written notice of the increase to each Representative and to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives.

(b) Except as provided in paragraph (a) of this subsection, amend or suspend any rule of proceeding set forth in subsections (1) to (4) of this resolution. The amendment or suspension may be made by providing written notice of the amendment or suspension to each Representative and to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives.

**HB 5028** Health Related Licensing Boards

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians, State Mortuary and Cemetery Board, Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine, Occupational Therapy Licensing Board, Board of Medical Imaging, State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board.

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Note:

Bill introduced and has had 2 public hearing back in February.

From Bill: Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Board of Examiners of Licensed Dietitians, State Mortuary and Cemetery Board, Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine, Occupational Therapy Licensing Board, Board of Medical Imaging, State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

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**SB 730 Relating to crime**

Eliminates sunset of provision that limits length of incarceration that court may impose when certain probationary sentences are revoked.

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Note:

Bill introduced and has had several public hearing back in april and was referred to ways and means.

**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Continues the limitation of 60 days that a court can impose as a sanction on a person who has received a sentence of presumptive probation and has violated the conditions of that probation unless the person was convicted of a new crime. Applies to crimes committed after July 1, 2011. Effective upon passage.

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**SB 5505 Department of Corrections**

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Corrections for certain biennial expenses.

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Note:

Bill introduced and has had 5 public hearings back in April

From Bill: Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Corrections for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department.

Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

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**SB 5537 Department of State Police**

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of State Police for certain biennial expenses

Bill introduced and has had 5 public hearings back in March

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**HB 5006 Capital Construction**

Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, payment of expenses from other funds collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

Bill introduced and has had minimal action since introduction and referral to ways and means back in February. committee meetings held May 26.

From Bill: Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011, payment of expenses from other funds collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

Limits expenditures from federal funds collected or received by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife and Oregon Department of Transportation for capital construction for six-year period beginning July 1, 2011.

Sets expiration date on project approvals and expenditure limitations.

Extends expiration dates for certain projects.

Approves proposed sale of certain armories.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

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**HB 5035 Lottery Allocation**

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**Note:**

Bill introduced and has had no action since introduction and referral to ways and means back in February. No committee meetings or public hearings.

**From Bill:** Maintains lottery revenues available to benefit public purposes during biennium beginning July 1, 2011, in Administrative Services Economic Development Fund.

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**HB 5036 Lottery Bonds**

Increases amount of lottery bonds authorized to be issued by Oregon Business Development Department.

Bill introduced and has had no action since introduction and referral to ways and means back in February. No committee meetings or public hearings.

**From Bill:** Increases amount of lottery bonds authorized to be issued by Oregon Business Development Department.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for Oregon University System for capital construction and capital renewal, code compliance and safety projects.

Increases amount of lottery bonds authorized to be issued by Housing and Community Services Department to provide financial assistance to aid in acquisition, renovation or maintenance of section 8 or other housing with federal rent subsidies.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for Water Resources Department to provide grants for improvements to drinking water systems, irrigation, drainage, fish protection or watershed enhancement, to assist local governments to mitigate losses resulting from reduced water supply for irrigation and retirement of water rights and to provide assistance in developing and obtaining renewable energy resources.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for Department of Education for development of data system to provide information on development and needs of children in Oregon and to facilitate identification, and evaluate efficacy, of appropriate resources.

Establishes Department of Education Early Childhood Data System Fund. Appropriates moneys from fund for development of data system to provide information on development and needs of children in Oregon and to facilitate identification, and evaluate efficacy, of appropriate resources.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for Oregon Department of Administrative Services for development of human resources information data system.

Establishes Oregon Department of Administrative Services Human Resources Information Data System Fund. Appropriates moneys from fund for development of human resources information data system.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds for Oregon Department of Administrative Services for development of performance management data system.

Establishes Oregon Department of Administrative Services Performance Management Data System Fund. Appropriates moneys from fund for development of performance management data system.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2011.

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**SB 5508 Emergency Fund**

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Emergency Board for allocations during biennium.

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**Note:**

Bill introduced and has had no action since introduction and referral to ways and means back in February. No committee meetings or public hearings.

**From Bill:**

In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$20,000,000 for the purposes for which the Emergency Board lawfully may allocate funds.

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**SB 939 Program Change**

Appropriates moneys to Emergency Board for allocation to Oregon Health Authority for caseload growth in Oregon Health Plan Plus program occurring in second fiscal year of biennium.

Bill introduced and has had no action since introduction and referral to ways and means back in February. No committee meetings or public hearings.

From Bill: In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Emergency Board, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_, to be allocated to the Oregon Health Authority for caseload growth in the Oregon Health Plan Plus program that occurs during the second year of the biennium.

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
